Artery live is a rural touring scheme offering exciting professional performances in theatre, music, dance, comedy and family shows, working with a wide range of local venues in the East Riding of Yorkshire.

Between October 2014 and May 2015, we welcome nine professional companies and artists:

Pacific Curls play exotic rhythms in 'Celtic Roots, Pacific Soul'. Celtic fiddle, fabulous vocals and exceptional musicianship make Pacific Curls world class. Two Gents Productions tackle the classic war of the sexes in *The Taming of the Shrew* with their distinct style. We welcome back Máire Ní Chathasaigh & Chris Newman with their blend of traditional Irish music, hot jazz, bluegrass and baroque; and Duckegg Theatre add a twist to the story of Peter Pan by setting it in a supermarket. In 2015 we have 3 companies from Canada: Ian Sherwood plays in concert, an award winning singer and guitarist; Theatre Newfoundland's performance *With Cruel Times in Between*, a beautifully crafted play; and Melody A. Johnson in *Miss Caledonia*, a story based on her mother's ambition to make it in Hollywood and get away from her life on a farm. We also have home-grown work of Chanje Kunda's *Amsterdam*, a play adapted from her poems. *Amsterdam* is a unique experience; part autobiography, part travelogue, part lyrical drama. The Flanagan Collective's *Sherlock Holmes: A Working Hypothesis* is a fast paced, lighthearted evening of theatrical adventure based on the stories of Arthur Conan Doyle.

Artery was established by the Arts Council of England (Yorkshire) and East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) in 2003. We work with local promoters to programme high quality, professional companies to present work in community venues in the East Riding of Yorkshire.

Classifying their sound is a challenge. Their use of jazz cordial transitions, traditional Scottish fiddle tunes, expressive vocals, political and moving lyrics in Maori and English, their use of world instruments with Pacific style beats and moods, shakes and bakes it all into a contemporary intriguing edginess.

With appearances at the Vancouver Winter Olympic Games celebrations, WOMAD NZ, and UK, Earth Station, City of London Festival, Borneo Rainforest World Music Festival, Vancouver Island Music Festival, Winnipeg Music Festival, Ulsan World Music Festival (South Korea) and extensive touring throughout Canada, Australia, South Korea, New Caledonia, Europe and Aotearoa (NZ) this band creates a window into the global sounds of the Pacific, Scotland and beyond.

The Taming of the Shrew

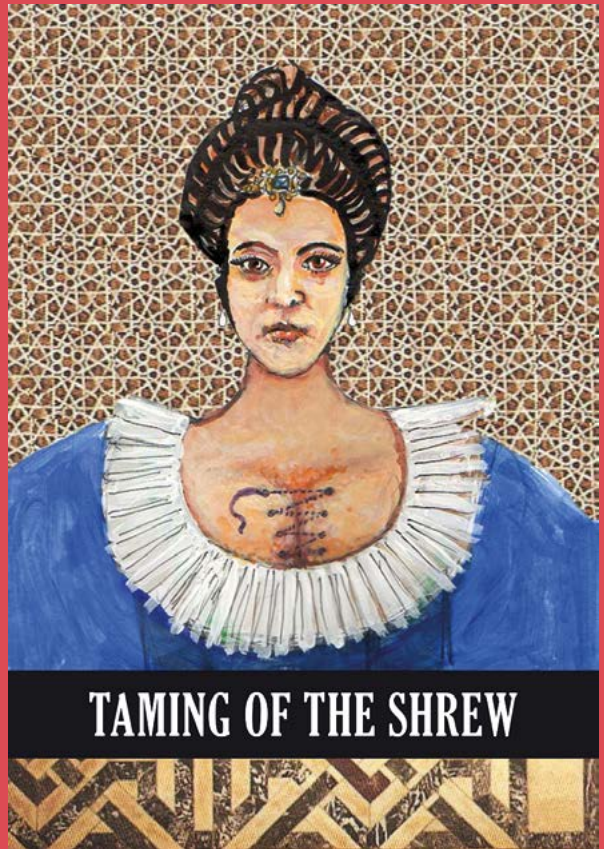

The celebrated virtuoso partnership of **Máire Ní Chathasaigh**, “the doyenne of Irish harpers” (Scotland on Sunday) and **Chris Newman**, “one of the UK’s most staggering and influential acoustic guitarists” (fRoots), has presented its unique musical vision in twenty two countries on five continents – at venues from tiny historic churches and splendid palaces in Kyoto and Istanbul, to London’s Barbican, Sydney’s Town Hall and Cologne’s Philharmonie.

Chris and Máire’s performances are rooted but eclectic, emotional but adventurous: a breathtaking blend of traditional Irish music, hot jazz, bluegrass and baroque, coupled with evocative songs, striking new compositions and Chris’s delightfully subversive wit. 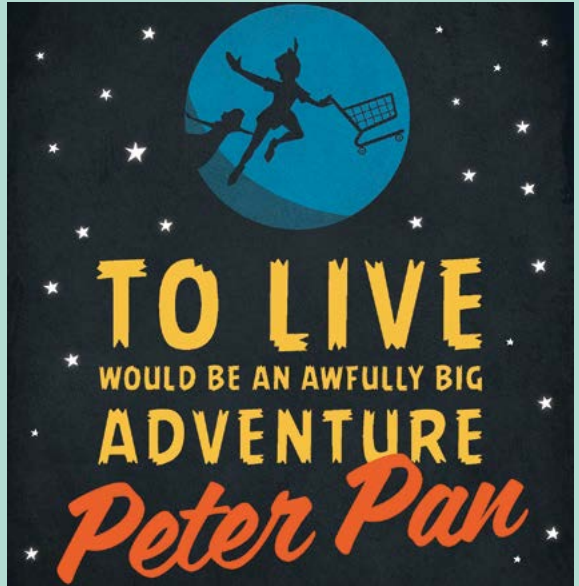
Peter Pan

A fresh, modern, musical retelling of Peter Pan with words by Haley Cox and music by Phil Collingwood exploring small town mentality, youth aspiration and the challenges of following your dreams. Directed by Gail McIntyre (West Yorkshire Playhouse Associate Director, Refugee Boy *****) and Musical Direction by Sean Green (Bill Kenwright Company).

It's five minutes until closing time at Priceland and cashier Wendy Darling takes us into the timeless story of Peter Pan – second star to the left and straight on 'til morning! Throw in a misunderstood Captain Hook, a hot guitarist Peter Pan,

a Tinker Bell straight out of 'TOWIE' and a sprinkle of fairy dust (oh, and an awesome soundtrack!) and you get a sparkling show guaranteed to get your toes tapping. Though the script was originally developed as a Christmas show it can be adapted to any time of year.

Ian Sherwood is a singer/songwriter, instrumentalist and storyteller. His music dances the line between folk and pop. He won a 2013 Canadian Folk Music Award for Contemporary Singer of the Year and in 2012 he was named Male Artist of the Year by the International Acoustic Music Awards.

Ian is a musician, storyteller and a constant creator. He has penned tunes for many other artists as well as theatre, film and television, but his passion remains primarily for his unique brand of folk/pop music. Starting his music career as an in-demand saxophone player in Toronto, Sherwood soon began looking for an outlet for his poetic side. His unique musicianship combined with his tales of heart-break, victory and adventure quickly gained him recognition as a solid performer, lyricist and player.

The play is adapted from her own book of poems, Amsterdam, and is a unique experience: part autobiography, part travelogue, part lyrical drama.

Chanje has a massive crush on a charming Surinamese guy living in Amsterdam. She met him on holiday. She didn't mean to meet him; she didn't plan to meet anyone. Her life back home in rainy Manchester isn't easy. So, she's

catching a flight to meet her fate. What will become of this 21st century, passionate, long distance relationship ... you're about to find out.

What happens when you abandon your responsibilities to chase your dreams?

Amsterdam was originally produced by Afrique Performs at Contact in Manchester and Podium Mozaiek Theatre in Amsterdam. An impressive artistic team, led by theatre and film director Juliet Ellis have created a super-modern, visual and physical piece, fusing spoken word and dance.

Writer & performer **Chanje Kunda** is a Manchester-based poet, playwright and performance artist, who has performed alongside influential modern poets Benjamin Zephaniah and Linton Kwesi Johnson. Chanje works nationally and internationally, including at The Royal Albert Hall, Calabash Literature Festival Jamaica, Royal Exchange Theatre Manchester, and Rise London Unite Music Festival. In 2012 she gained a year-long artist residency in the Netherlands, performing in Amsterdam, Rotterdam, Eindhoven and Groningen. Her collection of poetry Amsterdam was published by Crocus in 2013 and was also dramatised and performed at Contact Theatre in Manchester and the Podium Mozaiek Theatre in Amsterdam. Alongside her professional career, Chanje provides workshops that use creativity, diversity and expression as tools for transforming lives.

Sherlock Holmes: A Working Hypothesis

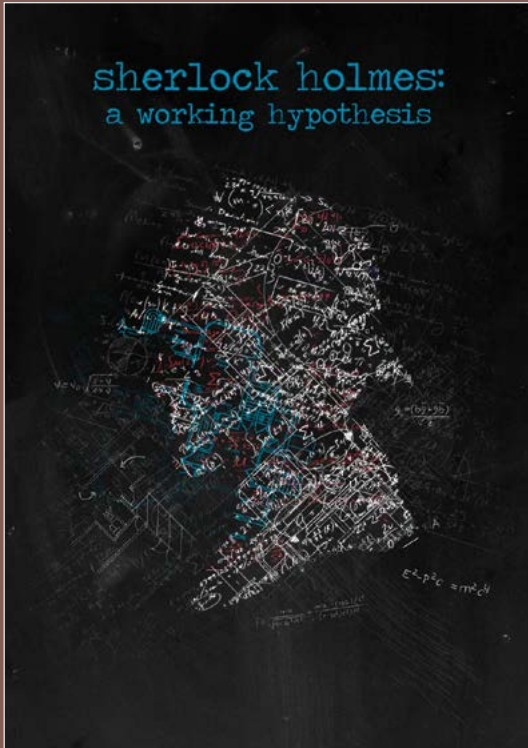

A lyrical and beautiful portrait of Newfoundland culture as painted by the rhythmic writings of one of Newfoundland's most beloved poets, Al Pittman. Using selections from his poems, prose, songs, and plays, we demonstrate the culture of island life, threatened by technology, which remains as true to our spirit as the salt in our breeze.

With Cruel Times in Between was originally created as part of a Youth Theatre Island Exchange Program with the Youth Theatre of Launceston, Tasmania, in celebration of the words and lyrics of poet/playwright Al Pittman. The company used the rhythmic writings of one of Newfoundland's own poet's, Corner Brook, and with selections from his poems, prose, songs, and plays, created this new play. With Cruel Times In Between, reflects a culture and island life of Newfoundland.
