FORGET ME NOT - THE ALZHEIMER'S WHODUNNIT

Ellerton

Jim's wife, a patient on a dementia ward. has died from what appears to be natural causes. Jim is a retired police detective and he smells a rat. He's determined to solve one last murder. The problem is he also has dementia. It's a case worthy of the greatest detective mind. But his will have to do. At the heart of 'Forget Me Not' is a detective whose tool of the trade - his mind - is failing him, making the most important case of his life something of a challenge to solve. By turns hilarious and thought-provoking, this is a one-man comedy poetry theatre show that has a lot to say about how we treat and perceive people with dementia.

So much so that, since seeing the show, Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust have recruited Rob to work with healthcare staff, using 'Forget Me Not' as a training aid in the areas of compassion and whistleblowing. This has been an entirely new form of training, with 93% of participants saying they would recommend it to a colleague. Rob Gee worked as a Psychiatric Nurse for many years.

This show was runner up for Stage Performance of the Year at last year's Rural Touring Awards.

LOVE AND SPICE

An elderly couple, still very much in love, look back on their lives together, reliving key moments through memories of the meals they shared. As the couple reminisce, their younger selves appear, and enact the memories of times past. The atmosphere is suffused with the aromas of a richly spiced life. With the couple's advancing age, each has lost one of their senses: he the sense of smell; she the sense of taste. Can spices - in particular Black Pepper and Cardamom, the king and gueen of spices - help them recapture what has been lost? Annapoorna, the goddess of food and nourishment, summons the butterthief Krishna and the sweet-toothed elephant-headed god Ganesh to help her cook a special meal in the kitchen. Together they will try to bring back the couple's lost senses, but what else will be rekindled along the way? Love and Spice combines different art forms and cultural traditions in surprisingly delicious ways. Blending Kathak dance and live music, with a chef cooking live on stage ... this is truly a multicultural feast for all the senses.
